

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Workplace hazards, which include anything that can cause harm, are more prevalent in cluttered, dirty, or disorganized environments. These hazards often go unnoticed and can result in serious injuries. Common examples include:


- 1. Tripping over loose objects on floors, stairs, or platforms
- 2. Being struck by falling objects
- 3. Slipping on greasy, wet, or dirty surfaces
- 4. Colliding with protruding, poorly stacked, or misplaced items

This month, we ask you to prioritize general cleanliness during your store visits. A clean store helps prevent unnecessary injuries. Use the checklist below to ensure a tidy workplace and discuss your observations with store managers. Thank you for being vigilant.

Checklist for a Clean and Organized Workplace:



 \square Floors: Free of debris and trash; sweep regularly.



☐ Aisles/Passageways: Clear walkways without obstacles.

☐ Trash Cans/Recycle Bins: No overflow.



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SAFETY QUALITY FOCUS

PPE: BODY PROTECTION

This course will help acquaint you with the various types of personal protective equipment (PPE) specifically designed to protect your torso, arms, and legs. It will assist you in selecting and maintaining the proper equipment based on the workplace hazards present. The content in this course is designed to comply with the intent of the applicable regulatory requirements - recall general OSHA requirements related to personal protective equipment, choose the appropriate body protection to guard against workplace hazards, and how to inspect and maintain body protection.
